CAKE is an ever-growing shared knowledge base that enhances climate adaptation action by: Providing accurate, timely, and useful information to CAKE users. Increasing awareness of adaptation projects, options, practitioners, and resources. Engaging the broader community to develop the field of adaptation.

CAKE's newest feature, the <u>Climate Adaptation Monitoring</u>, <u>Evaluation and Efficacy Testing Dashboard</u>, consolidates and organizes resources on monitoring, evaluation, and efficacy testing of climate adaptation strategies and offers critical insights into the performance, challenges, and effectiveness of adaptation strategies, enabling evidence-based decisions that improve their impact in addressing climate change.
